

Sal "Rocky" Cenicola

Whoever said great things come in small packages was right! Sal Cenicola proved it when he spoke to us about his fabulous career as a professional lightweight boxer. Although his career ended in 1988 at the age of 28, Sal recently entered the ring to prove that he "still has what it takes," beating Nathan Petty, a fighter half his age, in four rounds by unanimous decision. The fight took place at Peck Center in Fernandina Beach on April 13, 2013.

Sal, at 53 years old, set a record for the Guinness Book as the fighter to return to the ring with a victory after the longest period away from the ring – 25 years and 63 days.

A popular lightweight fighter through the 80s, Sal won 18 of his first 19 fights. He was well on his way to the world lightweight championship title when he injured his hamstring before his title elimination match. Forced to fight this semi-final match by promoters, his injury proved to be too great, and the fight was ended with Sal declared the loser. Critically injured from the fight with 130 stitches, 2 perforated ear drums and a detached retina, he left the ring, never to return until this year. From the video Sal shared of his recent fight, he still packs a heck of a punch! Weighing in at 155 pounds, Sal now tosses a heck of a pizza dough at his island eatery, Sal's Pizzeria and Neighborhood Restaurant. Anyone who has ever visited Sal's knows it's a fun place, with great food, and intimate atmosphere complete with Dean Martin crooning Italian tunes...*"When the moon hits your eye like a big pizza pie...that's amore!"*

Sal hinted that his boxing career still may not be over, and may even enter the ring again as a welterweight. Opportunities as fight promoter have also been discussed. Until then, expect to see Sal behind the counter, slinging pizzas, and singing...*"Oh Sole mio."* Best of luck champ. Thanks for sharing your fascinating career with us.
