

In for Monica Jolley, Paul Pieschel introduced fellow Rotarian and speaker, Dr. Zack Powell, who filled us in on his life, his loves, and his work – the profession of dentistry.

Zack grew up on a Tennessee Walker horse farm in North Georgia near Lake Lanier. He met his wife at the University of Georgia while earning his bachelors degree in Zoology and Biology. She was two years younger, and loved to fish (his passion), so it was a marriage made in heaven! By his own admission, it was love at first sight! They are now raising two children here on St. Simons, arriving just three years ago after selling a successful dental practice north of Atlanta. Zack currently works in Redfern Village having purchased the practice of retiring dentist, Dr. Garner. It's been a good move for the Powells as it gives Zack more time to do the things he loves – fish, duck hunt, fish, hunt, and fish. Did we mention Zack loves to fish?

Zack studied dentistry at Medical College of Georgia, and then practiced for three years under friend and mentor, Dr. Jim Bob Williamson...yep, that's his real name. Zack said he learned a lot from Jim Bob, and even traveled to Europe with him on a medical mission donating dental services to the less fortunate. "I would do dentistry for free," he said. "I just like it that much." Sounds like Zack has also been very generous sharing services, as he mentioned contributing about \$75,000 in pro bono dental work to needy patients in the Cumming area when he practiced there.

"We invest in our patients," mentioned Zack. "You won't see my picture on a billboard advertising services. For us, it's growing our practice by patient referral, one patient at a time. Ours is a small practice," he shared. "We have just 4 employees now, down a bit from the much larger practice of 37 employees we used to have."
