# Last Week's Program: July 10, 2012

## **The 2012 Transportation Referendum** Presented by David Hainley & Allen Ours

Two representatives from Glynn County were our guest speakers on July 10th to present the facts *(unbiasedly they reminded us)* on a transportation tax referendum which will be up for vote on July 31, 2012. Presenting were David Hainley, Glynn County Community Development Director, and Glynn Country Administrator, Alan Ours.

The Transportation Investment Act (TIA) was approved by the Georgia General Assembly in 2010 as a means to raise over 18.67 billion dollars for public works projects centered on Georgia's regional transportation systems. If it is passed, this referendum vote will levy a 1% sales tax for 10 years, or for a shorter time period when the full amount of the tax has been raised.

The reason for this transportation sales tax? A weak economy has resulted in lower fuel tax revenues creating a shortfall in transportation improvements funding. According to the Georgia DOT, existing funding levels, both state and federal, are insufficient to meet Georgia's transportation infrastructure needs today and into the future, negatively impacting the state's potential economic development. According to the 2012 Georgia Transportation Referendum fact sheet, Georgia spends less per capita on transportation than most other states.

The proposed sales tax will be levied in 12 state regions, including our coastal Georgia region which will garner 4 billion dollars of the proposed tax budget to cover 75 different transportation projects, 13 of which will affect Glynn County. It is estimated that approximately 25% of the tax monies raised in our region will result from visitors spending money in our coastal counties. It was stressed that tax monies levied here will stay here, and not be spread out across the state.

The list of projects planned for Glynn County are transportation corridors familiar to us all. Projects include the widening of U.S. 17, bridge reconstruction on U.S.17, widening of Glynco Parkway, reconstruction of exit 42 at 1-95, widening of SR 99, additions to the Glynn County Transit System, and facilities improvements at the Brunswick Golden Isles Airport, among other projects. If approved by the voters, the sales tax will have citizen involvement with a five person committee providing oversight in each region. As David Hainley explained, "We have no back-up plan if this tax vote is defeated. As TIA was written, it may not come up for vote for two years if defeated." Congressional approval of matching funds is the other way these transportation improvement initiatives could be implemented. But then, to what extent and on what timetable no one knows for sure.
