The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;


Fourth

Major General Jim Butterworth Adjutant General, Georgia National Guard

The commander of the Georgia Department of Defense assured us right off the bat that the Georgia National Guard is here to defend our borders – from those orange-clad Florida invaders to our south. Then Maj Gen Butterworth shared with us what the Guardsmen under his command really do.

Appointed Adjutant General in September 2011 by Gov. Nathan Deal, Maj Gen Butterworth is responsible for 14,000+ National Guard members and 500 state employees. More than 11,000 are soldiers in the Army National Guard, while 2,800+ are airmen in the Air National Guard.

Just don't call them "weekend warriors." Maj Gen Butterworth calls that an outdated term, since about 1,000 Guardsmen are "in harm's way right now defending freedom" in countries around the world. He added that, "We put our everyday jobs behind us to take up arms. And in a real-world threat, we're looking over our shoulder even here at home."

The National Guard occupies a dual role: to supply units to combatant commanders and to provide homeland defense. Should a hurricane threaten the Georgia coast, the National Guard will be here. In fact, the National Guard is already here in Glynn County, he pointed out, introducing two guests: Lt Col Charles West and CMSgt David West, both of Brunswick.

How can we as Georgia citizens and Rotarians support our National Guard? Maj Gen Butterworth suggests four ways:

Support Guardsmen when they return home from war zones

Hire a hero (some 30 percent will be unemployed when they get back)

Support Guard families

Remember the troops in our prayers (Georgia Army National Guard troops are deployed in Afghanistan until October)
