# Last Week's Program: August 21, 2012 Luz Borrero Purpose Built Communities

Every now and then we are treated to a luncheon presentation that truly inspires us. Such was the case from our most recent speaker, Luz Borrero, from Purpose Built Communities based in Atlanta, Georgia.

Ms. Borrero and her colleagues are truly changing the world for the better. With seed money and support provided by the team of Warren Buffet, Julian Roberts and Tom Cousins, Purpose Built Communities is an urban renewal organization with a holistic approach to the transformation of impoverished inner-city areas across the nation. Their first project which started in 1995 was the transformation of the impoverished, blighted, and high crime area of East Lake Meadows in South Atlanta. The \$120 million revitalization of the neighborhood into East Lake Village is now a living model of urban transformation at its finest. East Lake Village now boasts some of the lowest crime statistics in the inner city, some the highest academic scores at its schools, and some of the lowest unemployment rates in the City of Atlanta. It is also an ethnically and economically diverse neighborhood with mixed income housing, a cradle-to-college educational pipeline system, and community facilities and services which make it a rewarding place to live.

Based on methods learned from the revitalization of Atlanta's East Lake neighborhood, Purpose Built Communities is now helping locally led organizations across the country develop the strategies and partnerships needed to effectively address all issues that entrap neighborhoods and people in intergenerational poverty in cities where it is most needed.

As their Mission and Vision states: "To catalyze and accelerate holistic community revitalization across America by inspiring and advising visionary local leaders." Purpose Built Communities breaks the cycle of intergenerational poverty, creating a world where geography no longer limits human potential. Purpose Built Communities is now influencing change in neighborhoods in Indianapolis, Charlotte, Omaha and New Orleans, among other cities.
