Last Week's Program: August 28, 2012 **Dr. Daniel Williams**

Keeping Israel as a Sovereign Democratic State

Our guest speaker, Evangelical Episcopal Bishop Dr. Daniel Williams from Ponte Vedra graced our podium with a Hebrew prayer asking for the blessing of the food. The prayer had true significance—given that his topic centered on the State of Israel-their challenges, threats and history.

As Williams stated, "to understand the plight of Israel, it is important to recognize that Israel is totally surrounded by hostile Arab nations," – specifically, Lebanon to the north, volatile Syria in the northeast, Jordan in the east, politically fragile Egypt on the southwest, and the Red Sea to the south, comprising an Arab population of over one-billion. Israel is a nation of seven-million residents, some 25% of whom are Arab settlers, or Palestinians and Arab Christians who remained after the 1948 United Nations resolution making Israel a Jewish State, causing native Palestinians to leave en masse. Dr. Williams also related that democratic Israel is threatened by other hostile dictatorial regimes including Iran to the northeast with their developing nuclear capabilities. Israel has signed peace treaties with Egypt and Jordan but efforts to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict have not resulted in peace in the region. "Israel is a powder keg that can explode at anytime, "he warns. "If Iran successfully develops a nuclear weapon, they will use it against Israel."

He stresses the importance of supporting Israel and its democracy as the only true ally of the United States in the Middle East. He warned about the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA), which gives 1.23 billion dollars each year to Israel's Arab neighbors, half of which is funded by the United States, the largest single contributor. UNRWA is a relief and human development agency originally intended to provide jobs on public works projects and direct relief for hundreds of thousands of refugee Palestinians ho fled Israel during the fighting that followed the end of the British mandate over Palestine in 1948. Now, experts agree that UNRWA is not part of the solution to the Arab-Israeli conflict but more a part of the problem including funding to Palestinian refugee camps which nurture terrorism against Israel.

"Israel is the epicenter of world conflict right now. Theories about dividing Jerusalem into Jewish and Palestinian sectors to settle the conflict would be a disaster. What divided city has ever prospered and survived?" asked Williams.
