## Last Week's Program: September 4, 2012 Steve Landis, SEC Instant Replay Official, A Peek in the Booth

Before fellow-Rotarian Paul Pieschel introduced our guest speaker Steve (A.K.A. Jim) Landis, he was quick to remind us to keep giving generously to the C.A.R.T. buckets. Looks like Paul got confused and named Steve, Jim, in our preview Spray article. Anyway, it provided a good laugh and cheery beginning to Steve's informative talk about his career as an SEC Instant Replay Official in the Southeastern Conference. After many years officiating on the field. Steve now spends all his time in the booth helping to provide the final word using video for SEC football plays that require review (replay), or are challenged.

Although Instant Replay was introduced by CBS Television in 1963, college football has only been utilizing the technology since 2004 starting with the Big Ten. The SEC officially introduced it in 2006 and the rest is history on video.

Using 3 computer monitors, a server, a paging system, and TIVO technology for backup, a team of three—the Technician, the Observer/Communicator and the Replay Official—work in tandem to make sure every play in question is reviewed quickly and fairly. Steve shared some statistics, like: 4 out of 5 SEC games require an instant replay stop. And, there are approximately 1.7 stops per game. Did you know that 1 in 4 stops result in a reversal? Or that 1 in 5 stops result from a Coach's challenge, but, only 1 in 6 of all Coach's challenges result in reversal? He was guick to remind us that "fouls that are judgment calls by a field official are never challenged. That's how we keep the game moving and fair for all."

So now, when you see an instant replay during a UGA, or any SEC football game, it's because three guys in a booth are on the lookout to review any play of the game recorded on video in a moment's notice. And that's pretty cool.
