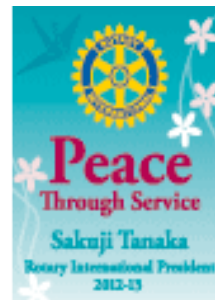

**2012 Georgia Literary Festival**

**Sharon Flores and Buff Leavy**

Community leader Sharon Flores, (wife of fellow Rotarian Michael Flores), joined Buff Leavy, President of The Brunswick News, to speak at our weekly luncheon about a new, very big event that is coming to the Golden Isles.

Now celebrating its 14th year, the 2012 Georgia Literary Festival is cosponsored by the College of Coastal Georgia, Golden Isles Arts & Humanities Association, Golden Isles Convention and Visitors Bureau & the Jekyll Island Authority, among 14 other local and regional sponsors. Held for the first time in the Golden Isles, the 2012 Georgia Literary Festival promises to bring a new level of culture and entertainment to our community. And, it will have plenty to offer.

The event includes three days of lectures, special events, tours, and culinary events, most of them FREE to the public.

Highlights include compelling presentations from 30 leading authors tied to the State of Georgia.

The keynote speaker of the Literary Festival is the recently named 19th Poet Laureate of the United States, Natasha Trethewey. Winner of the 2007 Pulitzer Prize for Poetry, Ms. Trethewey will speak at Atlantic Hall at the Jekyll Island Convention Center on Saturday, November 10, at 10:00 am.

Broken down into six unique literary tracks including Fiction, Georgia Review, History, Nature, Culinary Arts, & Children’s Literature, 30 renowned authors will conduct lectures relevant to their academic discipline, all of which are open to the public without admission fee.

Other highlights where reservations are recommended include a dramatic recreation of "Shame the Devil" by former St. Simons resident and writer, Frances Ann Kemble (1809 -1893), who will be portrayed by local actor and Director of Golden Isles Arts & Humanities, Heather Heath.

Also high on the list of *paid* ticketed events are a tour of Casa Genotta, the historic Sea Island home of noted American dramatist Eugene O’Neill; a St. Simons Island Tour as seen through the eyes of beloved local fiction writer Eugenia Price; and the four-course Wine Dinner hosted by noted wine expert Jane Garvey and Master Chef Hugh Acheson, to be held at the Morgan Center on Jekyll Island at 7:00 pm on Saturday, November 10.
